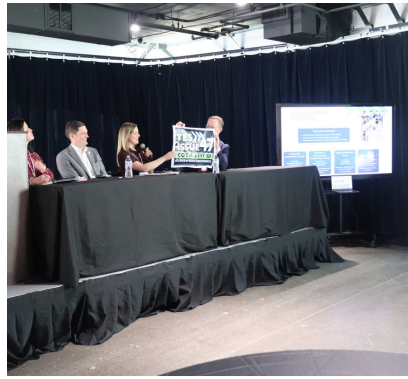
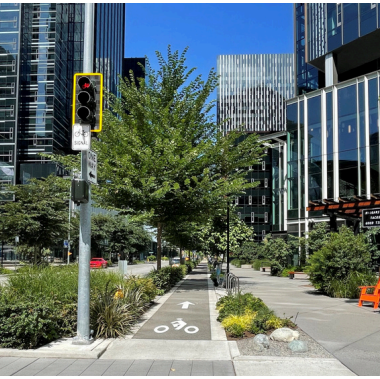

Bristol City, United Kingdom

Lisa Martin and Lizzie Thal-Jenkins highlighted the evolution of funding for alternative transportation initiatives in the Bristol City Center. The program has evolved throughout the years, and is currently a \$42 million program to deliver a Clean Air Zone in the city center.

The team works to engage businesses, schools, communities, and new developments and includes free active travel offers for individuals, over 250 community events per year, and support for businesses to encourage sustainable commutes and sustainable travel during business hours.

Bristol is the largest city in the Southwest of the UK, with over a half a million residents. Over the last decade, it has had the third largest population increase of the 12 core cities in the UK. We've had a huge amount of growth, and with that, being quite an old city, we don't have the ability to build more car infrastructure or roads. We've had to focus on sustainable behavior change and softer measures.

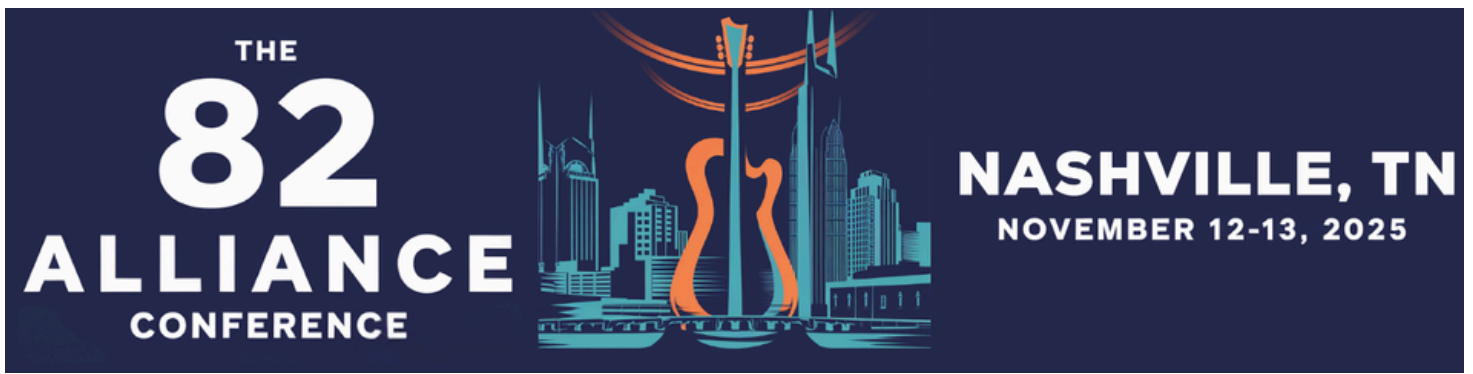

From a cost perspective and a sustainability perspective ... we worked with a number of large real estate businesses, large corporates that move lots of people. One of our first projects in the region was trying to optimize the amount of fleet being used... we saw really good results using our simulation capability. We saw large reductions in fleet and also travel time for staff, having a better experience using a commuter style service.

Luke Ward gave an overview of Liftango's Middle East and North Africa programs, specifically the United Arab Emirates, where challenges include a very hot climate from June to September and a heavy car dependency. Liftango's mission is to make sustainable and meaningful connections through engaging platforms that optimize transport systems and combat climate change.

UAE is focused on the design and deployment of shared mobility technologies, including a redesign of the transit network, with simpler, frequent "spines," seamless access with one app, one ticket, and real-time certainty, and safety and comfort, including shaded walkways, lighting, and clear wayfinding.



At the 2025, 82 Alliance Conference, attendees learned from and connected with mobility professionals from around the world. As our world evolves, we need to collectively work together to reimagine how people move throughout our communities.

Keynote Speaker Steve Adler, Former Mayor of Austin, TX



Steve served as Mayor of Austin from 2015–2023. He focused on equity, infrastructure, public safety, and preserving the city's magical quality of life.

During his tenure as Mayor, Steve helped initiate over \$25 billion worth of transportation and mobility projects and led the city through numerous major natural disasters. During this time, Austin was 1st in U.S. News and World Report city rankings, and led the U.S. in building new housing.


