As Assistant Director of Mobility at Vanderbilt University, Lindsey coordinates the university's award-winning transportation demand management program. Vanderbilt offers comprehensive transportation benefits for its community, including free rides on WeGo Public Transit and an incentive payment for employees and graduate/professional students who walk, bike, carpool or take public transit to commute to campus.

Lindsey was most recently Director of Advocacy & Communications at Walk Bike Nashville, where she worked to change policy and infrastructure to make Nashville more walkable and bikeable. Prior to Walk Bike Nashville, at MP&F Strategic Communications, her clients included the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) and the Metro Nashville Planning Department's transportation demand management program. While at MP&F, her work received multiple honors from the International Association of Business Communicators (IABC) and the Public Relations Society of America (PRSA).

Before moving to Nashville in 2014, Lindsey was the chief operating officer of Transportation Alternatives in New York City. She also served as chief of staff of the New York City Department of Environmental Protection, as acting treasurer of the New York City Water Board, and as a manager of NYC & Company, New York City's Convention and Visitors' Bureau.

With nearly three decades in public service, Sandi Ramos has focused her career on strengthening systems, advancing equity and access, and delivering innovative services that redefine how cities support their residents. Her work in launching the nation's first fully subsidized transit benefit for municipal employees in Philadelphia carries that mission forward — ensuring tens of thousands of workers can move through the City without cost or access barriers.

Sandi's career spans nonprofit, state, and municipal government, bridging sectors to strengthen Philadelphia and expand opportunity. A go-to for urgent, high-impact initiatives, she improves systems and processes that strengthen City operations. Sandi has also been known to teach Municipal Government 101 at the Community College of Philadelphia, showing new and aspiring employees how every role in public service contributes to keeping the City moving forward.

Her contributions include advocacy and programming for tens of thousands of at-risk youth and families, helping them overcome barriers and build lasting pathways to success; leading disaster resettlement efforts for hundreds of Puerto Rican evacuees arriving in Philadelphia after Hurricane Maria; administering tax relief for more than half a million residents and businesses; and driving a mayor-directed emergency contract conformance initiative that restored vendor payments and unlocked hundreds of millions of dollars to keep the City running.

This work has earned her multiple awards and invitations to speak at local colleges and universities on topics such as social justice, leveraging resources, and career advancement. Sandi earned her Master's in Human Services from Lincoln University in 2011 and remains committed to advancing equity and broadening access through programs that strengthen communities in Philadelphia and beyond.
